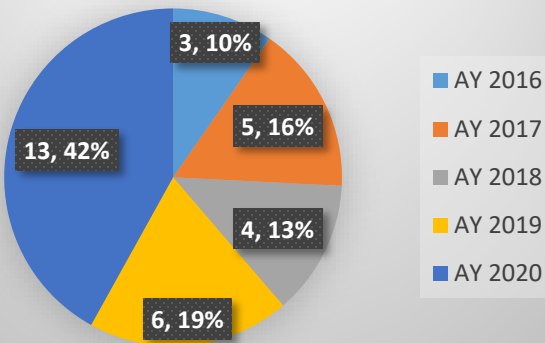

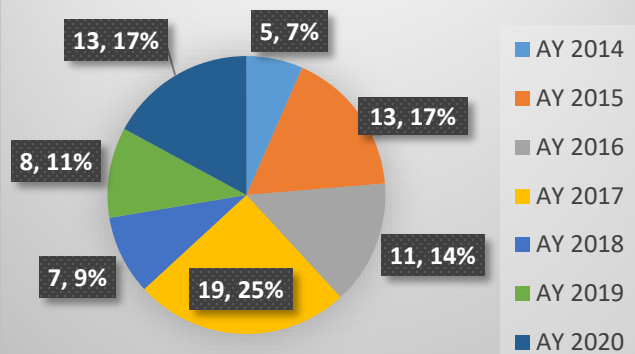

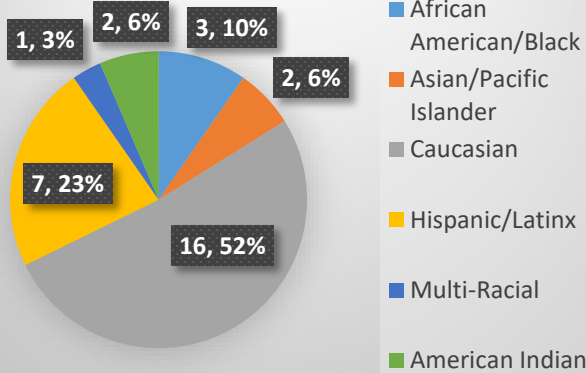

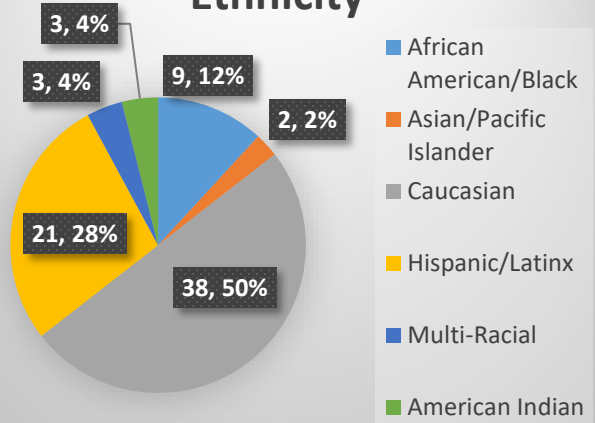

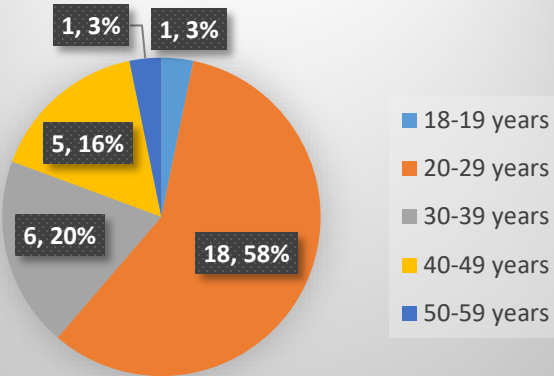
Ethnicity

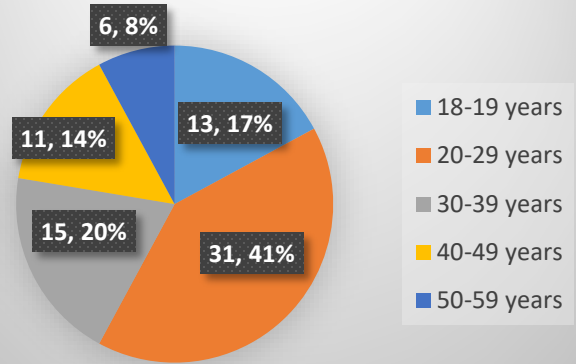

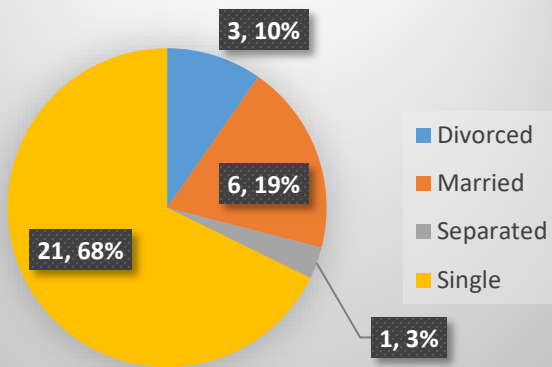

Age at Time of Entry

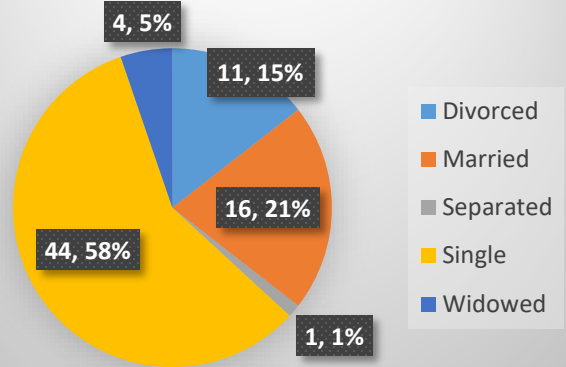

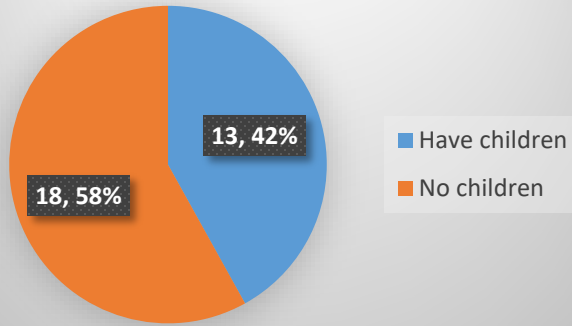
Marital Status

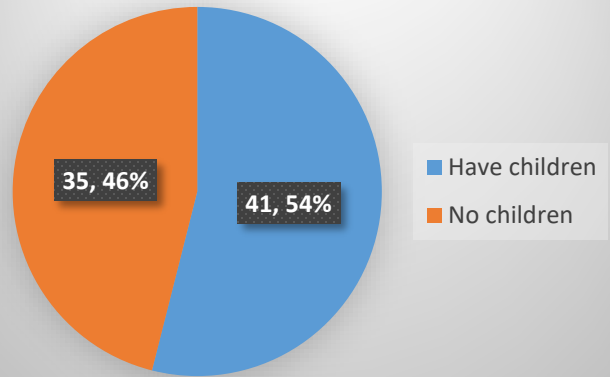

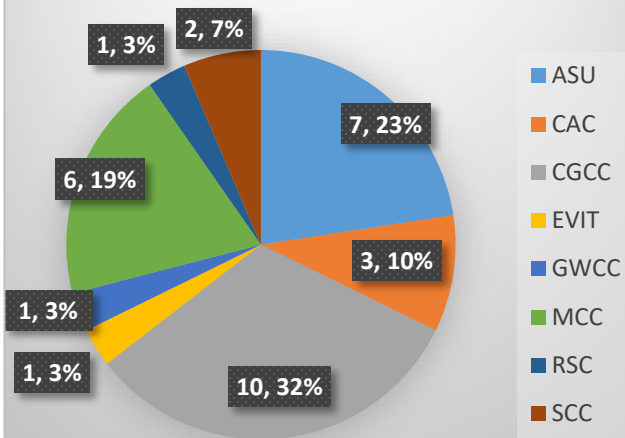
Number of children ranges from 1 to 6

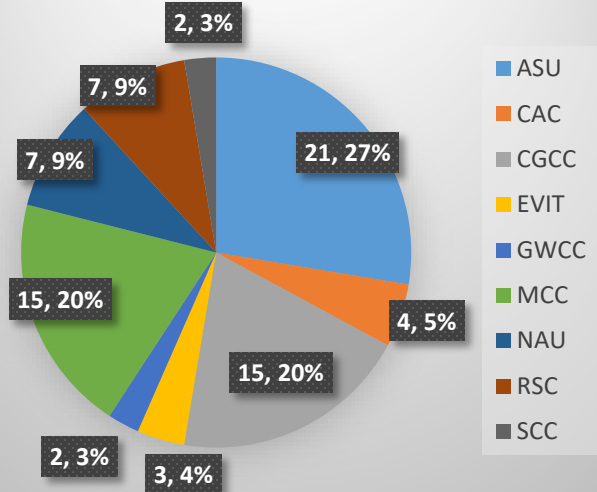

School Enrollment



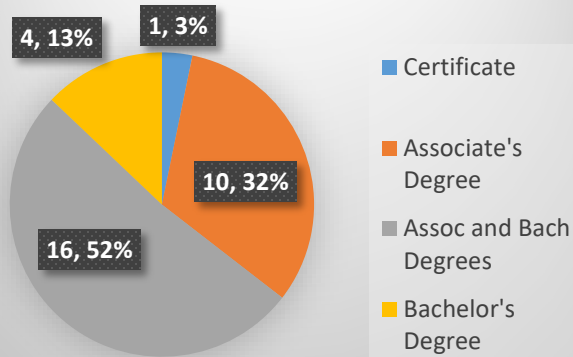

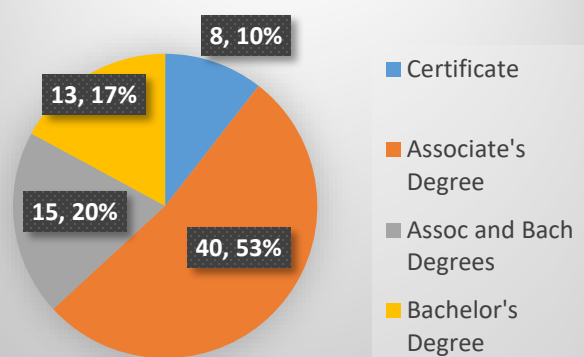

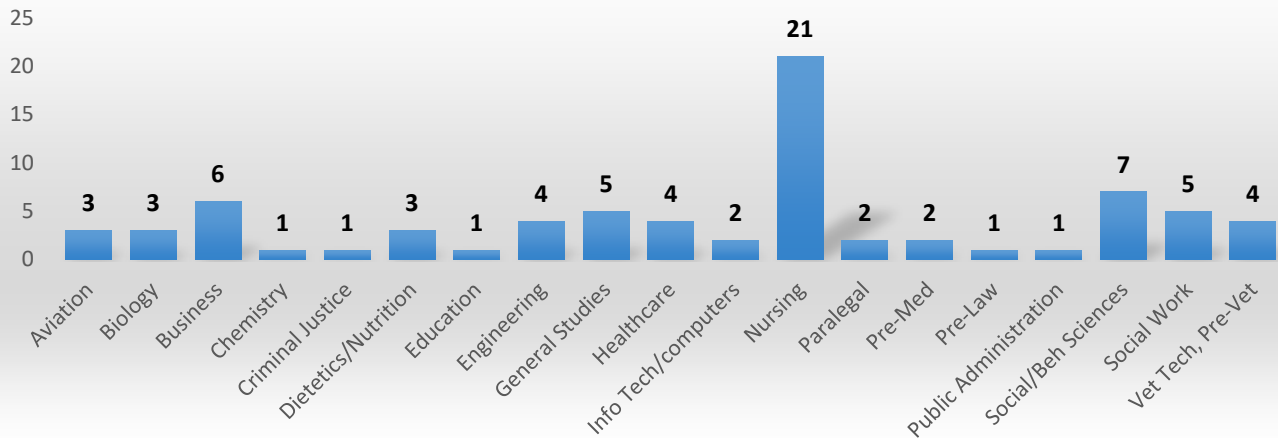

Other information (AY 2020):

- 13 (42%) have experienced poverty
- 11 (35%) are caring for a loved one, other than their children
- 9 (29%) have experienced violence
- 9 (29%) are the first-generation of their family to attend college
- 8 (26%) have experienced the death of a loved one
- 5 (16%) have experienced homelessness
- 3 (10%) have personal health challenges
- 3 (10%) have had substance abuse issues
- 1 (3%) comes from the foster care system
- 1 (3%) is an immigrant refugee

- 32 (42%) have experienced poverty
 - 22 (29%) are caring for a loved one, other than their children
 - 20 (26%) have experienced violence
 - 18 (24%) are the first-generation of their family to attend college
 - 15 (20%) have experienced the death of a loved one
 - 18 (24%) have experienced homelessness
 - 5 (7%) have personal health challenges
 - 7 (9%) have had substance abuse issues

 - 2 (3%) are Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) students
 - 35 of the 45 alumni scholars have graduated with their degrees (78%)
- To put this in perspective: For 2019, the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) reports that at

	less selective 4-year institutions (such as we have in Arizona) 31% of students completed a bachelor's degree within 6 years. For at-risk students, the percentage of completers varies by institution, but the national average is far below the 31% mark.
